LEADING GUIDING PRINCIPLE CONCEPTS

Process:

- 1. On July 15, CPAC Steering Committee members identified leading guiding principle concepts from individual nominations in the survey results to determine the refined list of broad topics.
- 2. These were intended to guide further refinement at the July 22 CPAC meeting.
- 3. The goal is to generate a list of between 12 and 15 guiding principles

The exercise resulted in the following topics:

• Environment: (11)

- Public space will be dedicated to meeting Kaka'ako's required acreage for parks
- o Respect the dynamic interaction of people and land in mauka and makai
- o Green space and parks
- o Open space/View planes
- o Access, trails
- o Coastal Resources
- o Bio-Hazards
- o Sustainability (water, energy, etc.)
- o Building design
- o Historic preservation
- Consistency w/ all laws, relevant plans and regulations

• Education (4)

- o Venue for teaching Hawaiian culture
- o Creating need for Hawaiian cultural experts
- o Ecology/sustainable practice
- o Clustering of educational and cultural uses (synergy)

• Community and Cultural (combined) (7)

- o Safety
- Open to all / activities for residents / visitors
- o Cultural opportunities
- o Parking / vehicular access
- o Community education: ocean, arts
- Gathering place/performance center (visual, traditional, museum, multicultural)
- o Traditional cultural (space, uses, ocean)

• Viability and Sustainability (9)

- Public uses on public land in the public interest
- o Compatible public uses within spaces
- o Restaurants/cafes/green markets
- Public/private partnerships, conservancy model
- o HCDA/Community partnership
- o Small businesses small scale
- Uses reflecting local flavor (e.g., small businesses)
- o Commercial fishing/ existing marine business
- o Keiki programs
