The community is invited to a weekend of public meetings designed to inform and gather input on the future planning of the Kakaako Makai District. These collaborative sessions will be held on January 30, 31 and February 1, 2010 at the John A. Burns School of Medicine.

The Kakaako Makai District offers the potential of becoming the gathering place for the residents of Honolulu and visitors alike. The HCDA has worked with community groups represented by Kakaako Makai Community Planning Advisory Council (CPAC) and other stakeholders in establishing a vision and guiding principles for future development of the area. Hawaii Community Development Authority (HCDA), a State agency that was established by the State Legislature in 1976, supplements traditional community renewal methods by promoting and coordinating public and private sector community development in urban areas in the State that are in need of timely redevelopment. In creating the HCDA, the Legislature designated the Kakaako area of Honolulu as the Authority's first Community Development District, recognizing the area's potential for increased growth and development and its inherent economic importance to Honolulu as well as to the State. This Legislative vision realizes that mixed use redevelopment of Kakaako will offer tremendous opportunities for housing, parks, and open areas, as well as new commercial and industrial space in close proximity to downtown Honolulu.
