

MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENTS AND MILESTONES

- 1976 State Legislature creates the Hawaii Community Development Authority (HCDA).
- 1982 Kaka'ako Plan and Rules signed into law.
- 1987 State Legislature expands Kaka'ako District's boundary to include the Honolulu waterfront area from Kewalo Basin to Aloha Tower.
- 1988 Improvement District 1 infrastructure improvements completed. Project involved 100 acres bounded by Punchbowl, King, Cooke, Queen, South and Auahi Streets, and Ala Moana Boulevard.
- 1990 Scenic five-acre Kewalo Basin Park completed by HCDA.
- 1990 Improvement District 2 infrastructure improvements completed. Project involved 110 acres bounded by Keawe, Auahi, Coral, Pohukaina, Cooke and Ilalo Streets to the ocean.
- 1991 Kamakee Vista affordable family housing complex completed by HCDA.
- 1992 Pohulani elderly housing project completed by HCDA.
- 1992 Na Lei Hulu Kupuna senior rental housing project completed by HCDA.
- 1992 Grand opening of the 30-acre Kaka'ako Waterfront Park.
- 1993 Kauhale Kaka'ako mixed-use family rental project completed by HCDA.
- 1993 Improvement District 3 infrastructure improvements completed. Project involved 60 acres bounded by Cooke Street, Kapiolani Boulevard, Halekauwila, Keawe, Coral, Victoria and Curtis Streets.
- 1994 Honuakaha affordable senior rentals and for-sale condominium project completed by HCDA.
- 1995 Kewalo Basin harbor improvements completed.
- 1995 HCDA's work on Children's Discovery Center completed.
- 1998 Kaka'ako Makai Gateway Park (ID-5) completed.
- 1999 Improvement District 4 infrastructure improvements completed. Project involved improvements to Kamakee Street (from Kapiolani Boulevard to Queen Street).
- 2000 Construction completed on Ward Avenue Extension Project (ID-6). The project created a new roadway from the intersection of Ward Avenue and Ala Moana Boulevard to the intersection of Ahui and Ilalo Streets, along with roadway and utility system enhancements.





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- 2000 Kaka'ako Waterfront Park Master Plan adopted.
- 2002 Construction completed on Kamakee Street Extension Project (ID-7). Project realigned Kamakee Street, between Queen Street and Ala Moana Boulevard, and created a four-way signalized intersection at Ala Moana Boulevard and Ala Moana Park Road.
- 2002 Ehime Maru Memorial constructed and dedicated in the Kaka'ako Waterfront Park.
- 2002 Kaka'ako Waterfront Business Plan adopted. The Plan established a specific vision, mission and strategy for future development of the Kaka'ako Waterfront.
- 2002 State Legislature adds Kalaeloa Community Development District (former Barbers Point Naval Air Station) to HCDA's jurisdiction.
- 2002 Construction started on the University of Hawaii John A. Burns School of Medicine (JABSOM) at the site bounded by Ilalo Street, the Kaka'ako Makai Gateway Park, the Kaka'ako Waterfront Park, and Fort Armstrong at the Waterfront.
- 2003 Construction completed on the Ilalo Street Improvements Project (ID-9). The project widened and enhanced the infrastructure on Ilalo Street, from Ahui to South Streets.
- 2003 Construction completed on Forrest Avenue Realignment Project (ID-8). Project involved the realignment of Forrest Avenue with South Street to reconfigure the surrounding land into three development-ready parcels for commercial development and a reconfiguration of a portion of the container cargo yard.
- 2003 MADD (Mothers Against Drunk Driving) Memorial installed in Kaka'ako Waterfront Park.
- 2004 Construction completed on the Queen Street Extension Project (ID-10). This project constructed a new roadway extending Queen Street from Kamakee to Waimanu Streets. HCDA will develop two new park sites, totaling 109,000 square feet, along both sides of the Queen Street Extension.
- 2005 Construction started on Ahui/Ohe/Olomehani Streets Improvements Project (ID-12) in Kaka'ako Makai area.
- 2005 JABSOM's new bioscience research lab and education buildings are opened.
- 2005 Following a Request for Proposals process, the Authority begins discussions with A&B Properties, Inc., the selected master developer for Kaka'ako Waterfront lands.
- 2005 Authority adopts a Strategic Plan for Kalaeloa and refines a Draft Master Plan with the participation of the public and area stakeholders.
- 2006 Authority adopts and Governor approves the Kalaeloa Master Plan.
